

Director Youth/Families Ministries Report

- Youth Group: One night for combined 6-12th graders, splitting into boys/girls groups. Roe, Indigo Funk, John and Pam Schnare are regular volunteers.
- Sunday Morning Nursery/Sunday School/Donuts and Devotionals: The programs are running smoothly. Lead Sunday School Volunteers are set for the rest of the year. Hangout: Hangout will be on a weekly basis from 5:30 7:00 pm starting Thursday October 3, 2019. The work has been split among many people, hopefully making the program more sustainable than before.

- **Trunk or Treat:** Trunk or Treat will be held in the church parking lot during Hangout on Halloween 10-31-19. The plan is to serve the winning chili from the in-house chili cook-off Sunday October 20, 2019.
- **Student Leader Training:** On 9-15 leadership training was held for 8-12th graders interested in becoming Student Leaders, primarily for Hangout, serving as assistants to the adult leaders.
- **Upcoming Event:** A Fall Retreat is being planned for November 1-3 at Mendocino Retreat Center (affiliated with First Presbyterian Church, Mendocino) for our 6-12th graders.

Resource Council Reports:

- **Finance:** The Session was presented with three reports: 1) Income Statement for General Funds, August 2019 vs. Budget. FPCU budgeted income of \$18,885, however, the church received \$19,587. At the same time budgeted total expenses were projected to be \$27,751, but were only \$26,694. Expenses were more in August than normal due to three payrolls. The church is currently on track with a strong YTD giving to have a shortfall for 2019 to income of \$5,400, which is significantly under the budgeted shortfall of \$31,467. 2) Designated Income and Expenses. By the end of August Designated Funds received an additional \$15,596. At the same time expenses have been \$13,084. The balance at the end of August was \$44,165. 3) PresBeat Summary. AS of 8-31-19 income as \$172,744, expenses were \$177,458, with a shortfall of \$4,714. The total in the checking account was \$132,521, while the balance in savings was \$147,735. The Designate Funds total in the checking account was \$44,165.
- **Buildings and Grounds:** Next meeting 10-3-19: budget will be discussed/developed. Next workday 10-12-19.
- **Personnel:** Continuing research on Fingerprinting and Background check process.
- Nominating: Four Elder, four Deacon, and 3 Nominating Committee (congregational) positions will need to be filled.

Family Council Reports:

- Worship and Music: Operation Christmas Child presentation October 6, 2019.
- **Christian Education:** The curriculum has been well received by teachers and children. Former classroom teachers have been a positive influence on the program.
- Communication: Denise and Perry are developing a new website design.
