Resurrection Appearances of Jesus, Part 2

Jesus is alive! And *Jesus is transforming us into the people He created us to be.*



This Easter season we have seen some of the amazing ways in which Jesus is giving new life to His people. For example, 14 people have committed to becoming new members of the congregation. We have also seen 4 people baptized.

Before I was mobilized and deployed by the US Navy to serve as a Navy chaplain in Djibouti, I preached a series of sermons on some of the Resurrection appearances of Jesus in the Bible. We looked at how Jesus showed Himself alive to Mary Magdalene (John 20:1-18), to the disciples (John 20:19-29), to some of His followers in the town of Emmaus (Luke 24:13-35), and then to over 500 people at one time (I Corinthians 15:1-11).

In the coming weeks I'll preach another series of sermons on some more Resurrection appearances in the Bible. Jesus also showed Himself to His brother James (I Corinthians 15:1-11), to Stephen (Acts 7:54-8:3), and to Paul (Acts 9:1-19).

Please look up these passages of Scripture in the Bible and prayerfully reflect on them. The Men's Bible Study is working through the Book of Acts, so we'll be studying about how the Lord appeared to Stephen and Paul. (About nine men meet on Tuesdays at 7:00 am which is phenomenal. Presbyterians typically don't believe in God until after 8:30 am.)

Jesus is alive and He's transforming us into the people He created us to be. I encourage you to look for the presence of the Resurrected Lord in your own lives. You will see Him as well.

We continue to receive letters of thanks for our contributions. This month, we received a note from Ukiah Valley Christmas Effort thanking us for the \$500 donation that we made.

Thank you for your donations for One Great Hour of Sharing on Palm Sunday. We received \$350. Monies raised by OGHS is the single, largest way that Presbyterians come together to work for a better world. The three ministries that they support are:

PRESBYTERIAN DISASTER ASSISTANCE

- Works alongside communities as they recover and find hope after devastation of natural or human-caused disasters, and support for refugees.
- Receives 32% of funds raised.

PRESBYTERIAN HUNGER PROGRAM

- Takes action to alleviate hunger, care for creation, and the systemic causes of poverty so all may be fed.
- Receives 36% of funds raised.

SELF-DEVELOPMENT OF PEOPLE

- Invests in communities responding to their experiences of oppression, poverty and injustice and educates Presbyterians about the impact of these issues.
- Receives 32% of funds raised.

The Missions Committee Team (as well as many others) have been busy working on our various ministries. We had a very successful Meals-to-Go fundraiser and were able to raise \$2800. I'd like to identify and thank all who helped. Kitty & Roe, Wilma, Tom & Gayleen, Michele, Jerry, Shirley and Kathy worked on food preparation. Len, Kevin D., Jerry and Roe took care of the meat prep. (Editor's note: we sold 36 full and 64 half meals!) Kathy and I sold five tickets to folks outside the church, who had not had the meals before and we got rave reviews. We'll do it again this fall.

Thanks to your Cents-Ability offerings in the baskets and at the Lenten Lunches, we have raised \$320 so far this year!

On May 5, Shelly Mack will be presenting a Minute-for-Missions to discuss our support of the Uganda Orphanage and update us on the mission trip scheduled for next January. In support of this ministry, we will begin collecting your "gently used" household items (furniture, appliances, etc.) shoes and clothing. These items will be sold at a rummage sale on June 8 to raise funds for the January mission trip.

On May 25th, starting at 9 AM, we will be working on the first Packing Party of the year getting the food packages assembled for the Caritas Orphanage as well as the troops in Djibouti. Thanks for your ongoing support of this ministry by donating peanut butter, beans and pectin based chewable vitamins for the children and cookies for the troops.

May God and the teachings of Jesus go forth in these ministries.



Session Meeting: March 21st

SESSION DECISIONS / ACTION ITEMS:

- Ordain/install David Head as Deacon

Pastor's Report: Co-conducted funeral service for Elvina Pardini with Rev. Larry Ballenger. Served communion with Alexis on 3/14 to several congregants.

Director of Youth/Families Report:

- Youth groups, youth choir, Sunday Morning Nursery, Sunday school, and Donuts/Devotionals are going great.
- Hangout was 3-6-19, with Dory leading (no assistant), and a small turnout (10).
- Plans are underway for a trip to Blackbird Farm, 4-6-19, followed by a stop at Hendy Woods.
- The Easter Egg Hunt will be 4-13-19 at McGarvey Park beginning at 10:00 AM, followed by lunch at FPCU.
- The 30-Hour Famine is scheduled for 4-27-19 to 4-28-19 at FPCU, with the participants learning about world hunger. Following the 4-28-19 worship service a congregation-wide potluck is being planned to break the fast.

RESOURCE COUNCIL

Finance: Three reports were presented to Session: 1) The General Fund Income-Expense Report noted that the projected February income of \$18,210 actually came in as \$20,037, while the projected budgetary expenses of \$21,445 were actually one \$18,292. 2) The Designated Funds Income-Expense Form noted two changes from January: the drawing of funds from the Compassionate Ministries line item and the increase in the Per Capita Giving line item (Jan., \$63.00, Feb., \$1,371). 3)The Pres Beat Summary indicated that FPCU year-to-date comparison of income to expenses indicated a deficit of \$1,570 (income, \$41,229, expenses, 4 2,799). At the same time the church account balances are positive: checking, #132,059; Savings, \$140,953; designated checking, \$40,461.
