With 26 churches represented and at least 10 pastors in attendance, the Nor Cal Christian Ministries 4th Annual Banquet Fundraiser on April 6th was a resounding success! We had in excess of 200 in attendance, and donations were plentiful and generous.

At one point in the evening we heard the testimony of Gabriel, a once-homeless man who one day decided to turn his life around with a visit to NCCM. A man in the audience by the name of Doug was so moved by Gabe's testimony and the similarity to his own story, that he asked if he could give his own testimony at the Center. A week later, he came and shared how God had

changed his life with our guests, and now Doug has made a commitment to come to the Center once a week to minister to visitors. Getting people like Doug involved in the ministry is not only a fulfillment of our mission, but an answer to our prayers.

We'd like to thank all those whose hard work made the fundraiser a success, but especially our outstanding servers. Wren Consterdine led a group of students from Redwood Academy, and Pastor Isaac led a group from RVCC Youth. Thanks to all of you; you did a spectacular job!

IN MAY we celebrated our first full year of ministry here at the Center for Hope, and what a year it has been! Just to give you an idea of the range and extent of services we provide, we have assembled some stats from our first year of operation:

- 8900 guest visits
- 2050 showers taken
- 8500 meals served

We thank God for these and other opportunities, but what really matters to us are the lives that have been transformed

through the demonstration of God's love by our volunteers, donors, and staff.

SESSION DECISIONS / ACTION ITEMS:

- Approve special offering for preview of "Pilgrim's Progress" film.
- Approve spending an additional \$250 from Children' Playground designated fund for Youth equipment.
- Approve hiring Julia Rodriguez as Children's Ministries Assistant.
- Approved request for use of FPCU facilities by Presbytery for Youth Triennium
- Approve Ukiah Garden club to hold two plant sales at our facility.
- Approve Redwoods Presbytery General Mission Fund Commitment of \$4800 for 2019

Pastor's Report: Served communion to shut-ins; conducted two marriages, baptisms on Easter Sunday; reported upcoming vacation days.

Director of Youth/Families Report:

- Youth **Group:** John Schnare is unable to continue in a leadership role with the jr. hi. group due to his work schedule. Consequently we need help! The sr. hi group enjoys working with the planter boxes.
- The Sunday Morning Activities: The programs are running smoothly.
- Easter Egg Hunt: The event at McGarvey Park was very successful, with over 150 attending! When planning for next year we may need to consider another venue and more eggs, games, and activities.
- **VBS:** 6-24-19 to 6-28-19. The theme this year is Yee-Haw!
- Budget Items: To date about \$830 has been spent from the Children's Playground budget.

RESOURCE COUNCIL

- Finance: Two reports were presented: 1)
 General Funds Income vs. Expenses, 3-31-19, indicated the March income of \$27,483 almost \$4,000 more than the budgeted income (\$23,502), while the expenses of \$20,012 were also less than budget (\$20,706); 2)
 Designated Funds Report, 3-31-19, shows a March income of \$5,342, which was primarily the result of the Meals-to-Go Fundraiser, while at the same time the year-to-date report shows income of \$7,447 and expenses of \$2,110.
- **Buildings and Grounds**: Next meeting is 5-30-19, and the next workday is 6-1-19.
