May God continue to bless our service to the Ugandan orphans in Nalugazi. We raised \$3100 that will be used to pay for the travel expenses of the Uganda Mission Team.

Funds earned during these events allows our Church to provide support for those outreach ministries we support locally and globally. ## Song Story~ "Pentatonic Scale"

#### What is a Pentatonic Scale?

This is a scale that has only 5 tones: 1, 2, 3, 5 & 6, where the more familiar scale uses 7 tones: 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 & 7. The pentatonic scale can also be played solely on the black keys of the keyboard.


What is most interesting is that most "Negro Spirituals" were written on the black keys only. Try it... try playing "Amazing Grace" on the black keys, starting with C#. It's fun.

Pentatonic scales are prevalent in African American music (*including music from slavery*), but they are common in Chinese music and US country music. It is also used by many lead guitar musicians, especially the blues musicians.

Greetings Dear Friends,

Another month has gone by, and so much has happened here at the Center for Hope. It has been a time of meetings and partings, but God has been faithful through it all!

In our quest to better the lives of the disenfranchised population, we have partnered with several organizations, such as Whole Person Care, Hillside Health Center, Mendocino County Veterans Services, Catholic Charities, Mendocino County AIDS/Viral Hepatitis Network (MCAVHN), Redwood Children's Services, and Compass Care Management, to support individuals in their health and wellness concerns.

This month's focus will be on Compass Care Management, an organization whose goal it is to help individuals to navigate today's complex medical system. We will highlight other partner organization in the months to come.

**Tuesday Clinics with COMPASS** We are thrilled to be partnering with Community Outreach Medical Patient Advocacy and Social Solutions, or COMPASS Care Management, an agency that works together with other local agencies, medical providers, and other resources to bridge gaps in care, focus on wellness and prevention, and help avoid crisis situations that lead to emergency room visits or hospitalization. Areas of focus include:

- Chronic Disease Management
- Medication questions
- Finding a Doctor
- Nutrition/Weight Management
- Navigation of Resources
- Obtaining Health Insurance/Social Services
- Employment/Education
- Housing/Shelter
- Healthy Relationships/Social Support/Spirituality
- Addiction Recovery Support
- Weekly Healthy Living Support Groups

COMPASS holds a clinic at the Center for Hope each Tuesday, where a Care Management Team comprised of registered nurses, social workers, and an outpatient wellness coach, can work with our guests on a one-to-one basis.

We are very fortunate to be partnering with such a professional and comprehensive organization!
